From Our Pastor...

As the calendar inches closer and closer to December, as the sun creeps lower and lower in the sky, as the days grow shorter and shorter... we know that the season of Advent is fast approaching. Advent is the season when we prepare our hearts for the birth of the child Jesus. But the weekly lectionary readings this time of the year are often filled with prophecy and apocalyptic texts, reminding us that there is a second Advent we are also preparing for: the return of Jesus to redeem the world. These biblical readings, paired with the darker and colder days, can make Advent feel less celebratory and more foreboding. And for any of us who have lost loved ones, this season that emphasizes family and friends can also end up feeling painful, if not simply bittersweet. The darkness of Advent approaches, and that darkness might be difficult to travel through.

I recently came across this poem by Jan Richardson, and I share it with you in the hopes that if you are wrestling with shadows this Advent, you might find hope and peace in these words.

A Blessing for Traveling in the Dark

Go slow if you can. Slower. More slowly still. Friendly dark or fearsome. this is no place to break your neck by rushing, by running, by crashing into what you cannot see. Then again, it is true: different darks have different tasks, and if you have arrived here unawares. if you have come in peril or in pain, this might be no place you should dawdle.

I do not know what these shadows ask of you, what they might hold that means you good or ill. It is not for me to reckon whether you should linger or you should leave. But this is what I can ask for you: That in the darkness there be a blessing. That in the shadows there be a welcome. That in the night you be encompassed by the Love that knows your name. —Jan Richardson

IVHP runs our local food pantry, local services for the homeless, and other local services. Your gift can be sent through the church or bring food to church to be delivered to the food bank.


Newcomers Access Center
